Sues Treasury on Tax Publicity.

WASHINGTON, March 6.—The District of Columbia Court of Appeals took under consideration today the case of Gorham Hubbard, Boston merchant, challenging the right of the Treasury to make public names of income tax payers and the amounts paid. A lower court had denied Hubbard's plea. Attorneys for Hubbard argued that his right of privacy is violated by publication of his tax affairs and that his business interests are adversely affected.

Mrs. Trudelle's Will Aids Students.

The estate of Mrs. Alice H. Trudelle, who died Feb. 25, 1924, was valued yesterday at \$43,528, of which she gave a life interest in the residue to her brother, Seeley F. Trudelle.
