FINDS "PETTERS" ON BUSES.

Washington Police Captain Wants Lights on Upper Decks.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3 (A).— The "double" part of the new double-deck buses that run along Sixteenth Street is in bad again.

A little while ago Washington society leaders whose homes front the rich thoroughfare complained that the upper decks of the buses forced them to keep their front shades drawn to preserve their privacy.

Now comes Police Captain F. M. Cornwell of the Tenth Precinct with a quite different complaint. Reporting to Major Fdwin B. Hesse. Superintendent of Police, today, he said the bus tops were finding too much favor after dark among the city's "public petters." He recommended that the upper decks be equipped with electric lights as a remedy for this condition.
