

JOHN J. INGALLS'S FUNERAL.

Interred in Family Vault in Mount Vernon Cemetery.

ATCHISON, Kan., Aug. 19.—Funeral services over the body of ex-Senator John J. Ingalls were held this afternoon at Trinity Episcopal Church, and subsequently interment was made in the family vault in Mount Vernon Cemetery.

Owing to the request of the family for privacy, in accordance with the expressed wishes of Mr. Ingalls, there was no great crowd at the services. The little church was filled with friends of the family. The exercises were very simple. Chopin's funeral march was played as the coffin was borne into the church. Only members of the family and the pall bearers, young men, sons of old friends, of the dead ex-Senator went to the cemetery.

Ex-Senator W. A. Peffer, who succeeded Mr. Ingalls; Judge W. A. Johnston of the Supreme Court, and A. A. Goddard, Attorney General, were among those who attended the services in the church.

Judge A. G. Otis, a close business and personal associate of Mr. Ingalls, estimates the ex-Senator's fortune at \$250,000.
