King Edward's Queer Automobile.

BERLIN, Aug. 24.—King Edward is traveling around Homburg in an autocar, which looks more like an armorclad than a carriage. It is a kind of char-a-banc, very large and gloomy, and painted green-black. It holds six people easily. The King is scarcely visible while in the car, and obtains privacy in his open-air excursions which would not be obtainable otherwise.
