ABOARD THE S. S. BELGEN-LAND, Dec. 4 (P).—Professor Albert Einstein, on his way to the United States, is getting on this ship some of the privacy which he missed during the days immediately preceding his departure. Today he had a long talk about anti-Semitism with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, but for the rest of the day was left by himself.
