RADIO TALK MADE PRIVATE.

Dutch Officials Test Invention to Prevent Overhearing of Words.

THE HAGUE, Sept. 19.—Secrecy in transatlantic radiophone talks, which can now be overheard by enterprising amateurs, may possibly be obtained by an invention which Dutch postal officials tested today between The Hague and the Dutch East Indies.

Privacy, it is said, was obtained by rendering the spoken words unintelligible while being transmitted from speaker to listener and then retransforming them into their original form at the receiving end. Further tests will be made before an official report is issued.
